DELUXE HOTEL - THREE NIGHTS

The Okura Tokyo is famed for its traditional Japanese beauty as well as its cherished simplicity and elegance offering a new combination of "traditional luxury" and "contemporary luxury." A total of 508 luxury rooms split between two buildings, about half of which will be covered with lush gardens and greenery. The Okura Prestige appears somewhat busier than its quieter sister, but one cannot help a sense of true Japanese retro architecture as you walk in to its well known lobby. The lighting, interior choice, and beautifully clad hosts/hostesses ooze luxury and calmness, right in the heart of the business district of Akasaka. Brilliantly located and easy to hop around in a taxi, we love this hotel for its simple elegance and traditional Japanese hospitality.





SHIBA PARK HOTEL - TOKYO

SUPERIOR HOTEL - THREE NIGHTS

Shiba Park Hotel has just undergone a completely new refurb (2021) so is looking super slick! We love this hotel for its location. Walking distance to Tokyo Tower; Shiba Park; lots of subway stations; and just a short taxi ride from Shinagawa station (hub for the Shinkansen).



DESTINATION HIGHLIGHTS



KYOTO

Brimming with tradition, Kyoto is the ultimate destination for anybody who wants to soak up time-honoured Japanese culture. Home to 17 UNESCO World Heritage sites, over 1,600 Buddhist temples, and 400 Shinto shrines, this ancient city showcases the heart and soul of traditional Japan. Kyoto boasts an array of world-class gardens, majestic festivals and delicate cuisine, all of which make much of the rhythms of nature and the changing of the seasons. While on first glance visitors may find themselves struck more by the ubiquitous grid-like structure of modern metropolitan Japan, a great part of the magic of Kyoto is in picking out its treasures: sacred shrines tucked in among shopping arcades, time-honoured teahouses nestling among modern businesses and the geisha of legend sweeping down backstreets among the tourists and souvenirs. Kyoto's charm lies in these details and whether you're here for three days or three years, the closer you look, the more you'll discover.



HIROSHIMA & MIYAJIMA ISLAND

Hiroshima is of course well-known for being the site of one of two atomic bombs dropped on Japan at the end of the Second World War. In the decades since, a bright and vibrant city has risen phoenix-like from the ashes. The Peace Park and Museum with visitors daily from all walks of life around the world are a poignant reminder of this source of Hiroshima's fame, and its stories of the importance of striving for fellowship over destruction are especially powerful. Other areas to visit in the city include Hiroshima Castle and the baseball stadium. The Shukkei-en garden is well worth an afternoon stroll, with a number of tea houses dotted about the grounds. No visit to Hiroshima would be complete without sampling okonomiyaki, a kind of Japanese savoury pancake before your eyes using the ingredients of your choice. If you have your first okonomiyaki here, it's certainly not likely to be your last.



ARIMA ONSEN

Arima Onsen is one of Japan's oldest hot spring resorts, dating back to the 8th century. This friendly town is officially part of Kobe city, but is separated from the main metropolis by Mount Rokko, which boasts dramatic views of the port and beyond. Visitors to Arima can relax and unwind in the numerous bathhouses. There are two types of spa water, known as 'kinsen' and 'ginsen' (gold and silver waters) respectively. These waters are high in mineral content and are said to have various healing properties. Arima Onsen shows its traditional face in the narrow winding streets of old wooden craft and gift shops and cafes and traditional guesthouses. The laid back atmosphere makes a nice break from Kansai's big cities, and (unlike most places in Kansai) many of the hot spring resorts do not turn away people with tattoos.



KOBE

Also located in the Kansai region of Japan, Kobe is the capital city of Hyogo Prefecture. A busy port city, Kobe has close ties with countries all around the world and a distinctive cosmopolitan feel. Kobe's Chinatown is thought by some to surpass Yokohama's, and the city is also home to Japan's first golf course, built in 1903. Perhaps best known in recent decades for a devastating 1995 earthquake, the city has now fully recovered and restrengthened and has a fascinating earthquake exhibit at the downtown museum. Although Kobe is justly famous for its highly regarded beef, some of its many other culinary delights include fresh sea bream and octopus from the nearby Akashi Kaikyo Channel (which happens to be spanned by the world's largest suspension bridge). Just beyond Kobe is Mt. Rokko, the setting of Arima Onsen, one of Japan's first onsen spa resorts, on record as far back as the 8th Century and still providing restorative soaks today! Mt. Rokko also offers breathtaking views of the city and the sea beyond.



TOKYO

Everything you've heard about Tokyo is true – and it is not. For if ever there was a city that you could not confine to one definition, this would be it. The never-ending hustle and bustle of the city creates an energy that is quite contagious. One minute you may be elevated 450 metres above ground overlooking Tokyo's sprawling metropolis, the next you might be cheering on two sumo wrestlers tackle each other in the sumo stadium. Despite the presence of people and stores everywhere, there is an order that allows things to work efficiently, seemingly against the odds. Tradition and technology stand side by side in this city that can be whatever you want to make of it.
